

UNTERRICHTSMATERIAL: JAMIE OLIVER – THE „NAKED CHEF“

It's hard to believe that Jamie Oliver is still only 39. Not because he looks older but because of what he has achieved in the 15 years since he first appeared on our screens. His business empire is estimated at more than 200 million pounds. Its headquarters are spread across an East London street and it has restaurants, retail, publishing, a television production company and a charitable foundation. His books have been translated into more than 40 languages. Incredible though it seems, next year will be the 10th anniversary of the launch of his campaign for better school meals. The „Naked Chef“ who, at just 23, transformed cooking on TV remains full of enthusiasm. His Christian name long ago became a brand and his new book and Channel 4 series are called Jamie's Comfort Food. Food has been central to Oliver's life since he was an eight-year-old boy helping out in the gastro pub his parents still run in the Essex village of Clavering. Oliver „loved“ his childhood, and his relationship with his father has been life-defining. „My Dad's a real character. He grew up in a pub. Dad has always expected a lot from me. A lot of physical effort. And certainly enough obedience. And Mum did, too. But Mum was soft and cuddly. Dad would fire people at work and Mum would rehire them and find out what the problem was. Mum was the silk glove, Dad was the iron fist. I was just scared enough of Dad – which I think is important. A little bit of fear doesn't hurt. But he was a very loving Dad.“ A pub, in Oliver's words, is Britain in a bottle. „I've always had a fascination for all types of people. My three best friends were Cockneys and gypsies, and I used to hang out with the old-age pensioners.“ Instead of pocket money, Oliver worked for his cash. He had to peel „tons of carrots“ and make the chips. „I was pulling pins of beer at the age of 10 but I loved it. I loved the concept of earning money.“ Oliver left school with only two GCSEs and problems with reading and writing. At college he realized that his boyhood experiences in the pub kitchen were his „real“ training. „I was getting distinctions and A-pluses – „Oh great, I'm not stupid. I've been told I'm bloody stupid all my life“ His big break came while he was working in the kitchen of Ruth Rogers's The River Café. In the right place at the right time he was filmed one evening, unscripted, by a camera crew making a programme about the restaurant. The „Naked Chef“ concept grew out of Oliver „stripping food down to its bare essentials. From stripping and bare to naked.“ Soon he was performing cooking demonstrations on the BBC's Good Food Show in front of 3,000 people a time. In his late twenties Oliver started the school dinners campaign and he convinced the government to invest. Today Oliver thinks that it's not only children who need support. „I'm starting to talk about old people's homes and civic catering in general.“
